Endings for Transformation

The foundational tenet underlying all the Gospel narratives is that Jesus came to reveal a God of life in its fullness (Jn 10:10)), and never of death or destruction. Yet, Mark who has accompanied us for most of this liturgical year coming to an end, carries a strong sense of foreboding, with Jesus foretelling the future of Jerusalem as a sign of the end of time, when the power of creation will come to nothing and everything will be annihilated into some primal meaningless chaos (Mk 13:24-32). However, such reading makes a mockery of God's presence and action, a charlatan that destroys his own masterpiece of creativity and of humanity into a hopeless finality of death and non-existence swallowing up the whole world and its history into the primordial chaos.

By drawing our attention to the imagery of a small bud sprouting forth the first tiny buds out of the coldness and empty fruitlessness of winter ravages, Jesus invites us into a completely new understanding of vitality and energy encapsulated in the apparent finality within ourselves and in our world. No matter how our life may sometimes bear the marks of a tree branch stripped bare and abandoned, God's living and active presence remains forever the sap of vitality flowing through the apparent deadness of luscious foliage and rich fruitfulness.

Jesus is urging us into awareness, alertness, and faith response by allowing this God-enriched power to transform us into people, fully alive and vital. The power of God making inroads into history is such a drastic and dramatic event that when we are prepared to accept this presence in our life story, things can never be the same. Everything becomes a stimulus to growth and new vitality, if we but accept the small and almost invisible sap of God's active and enduring love flowing in the challenging and sometimes bewildering events budding through on our journey. The end of time Jesus refers to is not a chronological ending but a call to 'be alert' now to the active and transforming presence of God energising our story. The upheavals seemingly crushing us into lifeless hopelessness are not agents of closure, destruction, or of unredeemable finality, but the divine call into a total and radical new way of being and of decision-making out of the barrenness, staleness, and deadness of a faith journey always and forever impregnated with the life-giving energy of God.

We are called to be ready now to meet our God not in death but in life, not in judgement but in encounter, not in fear but in energy, courage, and hope. We need to be constantly aware and ready now because with the presence of God things are different now, calling for different perspectives and lived relationships now, urging and energizing new and fresh decisions now in the sure knowledge that God is there.
