Reasons to Rejoice

We are in the third Sunday of Advent, which is also called Gaudete Sunday. The Latin word 'Gaudete' means 'rejoice'. It is a reminder to us that Christmas is near and our salvation is already at hand. Hence, we are invited to rejoice! Do we have reasons to rejoice?

On Thursday evening, we had the Year 6 Graduation ceremony at St Joseph's Church, Collingwood. Twelve of our children graduated and they looked very joyful because they were 'moving on', as one of the girls remarked. Congratulations to our young graduates! On the same day, the Results for the 2024 VCE exams had been released, with 47,461 students completing the VCE. It is an important milestone in their lives and they have a reason to rejoice as they have finished their schooling and are on their way to Uni or other paths in life's journey. These are individual achievements that calls for joy and celebration.

A week ago, there was another significant event that made a whole country rejoice. On the evening of Saturday, 7 December, Archbishop Laurent Ulrich of Paris called out in front of the central door, "Notre Dame, model of faith, open your doors to gather in joy the scattered children of God" and he struck the door three times with the tip of his crosier. And then the cathedral responded with the singing of Psalm 121 three times: "I rejoiced when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord.' And now our feet are standing within your gates, Jerusalem. Jerusalem, built as a city, walled round about." It was a great day for France to rejoice, as Pope Francis remarked in his message to the Archbishop of Paris: "Today, sadness and mourning have given way to joy, celebration and praise."

This weekend's Liturgy of the Word invites everyone to rejoice in the coming of the Lord and to celebrate God's presence. Prophet Zephaniah reminded the Israelites that God cares for them and has removed the judgment against them. He also declared that this God is in their midst. St Paul exhorted the Christians at Phillippi to always rejoice in the Lord and not to worry about anything because the Lord is near and God listens to their prayers. John the Baptist encouraged the people who were expecting a Messiah that he is at hand and that he will bring joy and a new way of living, for he will baptise with the Holy Spirit and fire.

The most striking fact of this weekend's Gospel passage is John's response to the people who asked him: "What must we do?" He wanted the people to share what they have, he told the tax collectors not to cheat anyone, and he asked the soldiers to be caring instead of intimidating and extorting others. I believe that if every person does what John wanted the people of his time to do, we would certainly have a world that is peaceful, filled with rejoicing people!

Let us have a reason to rejoice as we get nearer to Christmas! Fr Cassius
