## The Feast of St John Hoan, 26 May

Saint John Doan Trinh Hoan was a Vietnamese priest who suffered in the persecutions of Emperor Tu-Duc. He was a martyr of Vietnam, one of an estimated 300,000 Vietnamese martyrs.

John Hoan was born in 1798 in Thua Thiên, Vietnam; he belonged to a rich Christian family, which already had priests and martyrs. He studied at the Penang seminary and was ordained a priest in 1836, when he was nearly forty years old. He worked with zeal in all the districts where he was sent, noted for his gift of advice and his ability to solve disputes. He had to live in hiding because of the persecution, but despite all this he took care of the education of the youth, and the catechesis of children from which many religious vocations emerged.

St John Hoan was arrested in 1861 and sent to jail where he was tortured and interrogated; he was beheaded on May 26, 1861 during the government of King Tu-Duc. Pope John Paul II canonized him on the 19th of June 1988.

#### Longing for Inner Peace in Uncertain times

Everyone longs for peace. It is one of those universal desires – whether it's inner peace, peace in relationships, or peace in the world. This longing for peace, especially inner peace, is deeply human because our lives are filled with moments of certainty and uncertainty. Life moves between moments of clarity and confusion, stability and change. Therefore, the desire for inner peace comes from a deep need to feel grounded, to find refuge amid the unpredictability of life.

This weekend's Gospel passage is filled with Jesus' words of reassurance and love for his disciples who are uncertain of their future. Knowing that his disciples are troubled by the thought of his departure, Jesus speaks words of deep comfort. He assures them that if they love him and keep his teachings, both he and the Father will dwell with them – a promise of divine presence that transcends physical separation.

Jesus speaks to them of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, who will guide, teach, and remind them of his words. This is a powerful assurance that even in uncertainty, they will not be alone; they have a helper and a companion.

Moreover, Jesus offers his peace – not the temporary, fragile peace of the world, but a deep, enduring peace that transcends worldly circumstances. His peace is not just the absence of conflict but a deep, unshakable tranquillity rooted in faith and trust in God. Jesus encourages his disciples not to be troubled or afraid, reinforcing the idea that his peace is a gift that sustains them through uncertainty.

It is important to remember that peace isn't something we find, but something we create in small ways. One powerful way is to build a deep relationship with the Lord having confidence in his words and the assurance that no matter what happens, his love and guidance remain constant. This helped the apostles who faced many challenges in their life and ministry to experience deep joy and peace.

Secondly, when confusion and unrest weigh heavy on the heart, seeking support can bring clarity and comfort. Peace isn't always found alone; it often comes through conversation, guidance, and community. Whether it is speaking with a trusted friend, mentor, counsellor; reaching out can be a powerful step toward inner peace. It is rightly said that when we surround ourself with people who uplift and understand us, it brings comfort and peace.

As we celebrate the feast of **Our Lady of the Southern Cross**, the patron of our parish, may we turn to her in prayer, seeking her intercession to bring peace to our hearts, our homes, and the world. May her loving guidance inspire us to be instruments of peace, fostering understanding, compassion, and unity in all that we do.
