A Gospel Reflection from Fr Anthony

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

I wish you and your family a grace-filled Sunday. This Sunday, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons. This feast also calls our attention to central mysteries of our faith as stated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith.' The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to [us] 'and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin'."

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit: "But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you" Jn 12:7). In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Iesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future: "But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth" (In 12:13).

My dear brothers and sisters, reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Iesus and the Spirit share all: "Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you" (In 12:15). In this eternal sharing of life and love of the Divine Persons, we have a share. This is our future. On our part, let us share that divine life and love to those whom we will meet on the way through life. Fr Anthony Nguyen sdb
