## Saving or Staving?

As we come together for our Sunday gathering have we ever asked ourselves "What do I bring to this moment of encounter with God?" Am I aware of standing in God's presence focusing primarily on my concerns and personal requests, a one-way monologue on my own self often so empty and tired that I cannot even find the words to remind God that he's better to do something about it?

In response to the disciples quest about praying Iesus challenges us to go beyond an idea of a God who is not a doormat to hide our grievance, or a slot machine to satisfy all our needs on our own terms. Prayer is a matter of the heart expressed through the human experience of a deep relationship, embracing all that is life and life giving. Our coming to prayer today and every day is a personal and communal answer to God's inviting himself into our house and calling us to sit at his feet. making space and time for him. It is a call to remain attuned to the active presence of God at that specific moment which the encounter with God will certainly stimulate, even in the desert of our loneliness or the noisy humdrum of our daily life.

Have we ever reflected on the full implications of what we are praying maybe several times a day? Affirming and hope-filling the words of the Lord's Prayer may be, in reality they are a dangerous commitment to God in the midst of our life enjoining on us to stand with open arms and to be instruments and builders of His divine active presence.

May your kingdom come, we say; but then how do we react when things do not work out our own way, or the unexpected and unwanted crash into our life? Where and who is our God, then in our story?

Give us our daily bread! How do we pray the Lord's Prayer when the daily bread of joyfulness turns stale, or when loneliness, tiredness, abandonment, and guilt seem to be our only travelling companions and starve us to death? Do we deny the pain of struggle asking God to hide the harsh reality and take it all away by saying many prayers or deceiving ourselves into some cruel belief that this is what God wants?

May your will be done! God is not whimsical demanding stoic passive resignation in the face of injustice but a personal commitment to journey with courage and faith through difficult and incomprehensible situations, in the knowledge that He journeys with us and depends on us to stand up against injustice and rejection.

## **Continued Gospel Reflection**

The will of God we pray for commits us to accept that God is struggling with us and joining our human effort for a better world, even throughout and in spite the most negative and harrowing experiences.

Forgive us our sins, as we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. Have we ever thought of asking God to deal with us with the same measure that we use for each other? That is truly a dangerous commitment for which to pray. If I am not prepared to forgive, how can I honestly pray to God to forgive me?

Before we bring our prayers to God, let us bring God into our life by standing with open hands before Him for courage to sit at his feet with a listening heart fully attuned to His presence in our life, more than saying but to take up seriously the tasks we set ourselves in the Lord's Prayer.
