Whoever Does Not Carry Up His Cross And Follow Me Is Not Worthy Of Being My Disciple

No one can walk two paths at the same time. Life always puts people before choices, and choosing is giving up. Giving up becomes the rule for living and growing. The foetus cannot stay in the mother's womb forever, even though it is a safe and warm place. The baby cannot grow up if it lives on its mother's milk forever. Giving up is often a painful cut, like cutting off

Many people do not have the courage to give up, so they are tormented all their lives. In the Gospel of this Sunday, Jesus said three times: "then you cannot be my disciple." We have become disciples of Iesus, but to continue to be His disciples, we need to put Him above all other values.

Christians grow through choices and renunciations. The center is Jesus, the Son of God. All values become relative before the Absolute. Money and property are values. Parents, wife, children, and family are spiritual values. Life is a superior value. But even those values must be sacrificed when necessary, so that we can choose Jesus, the Value of all values. Of course we love our family, we love our friends, we love the earth that supports us, we love the sky that protects us, we love human life with its joys and tears. But we must love everything in God and under God, so that when we have to choose one of the two, we choose God.

Thus, although Christians are attached to creation, they still keep a certain distance, so that they can always live in freedom and peace. The point is to dare to choose and continue to choose, not to let the tower that has been built be unfinished, not to let the progress be stopped.

The point is to dare to go to the end, to continue to be faithful to a Love. We must strip ourselves of bad things, but we must also separate ourselves from the perverted passion for something good; loving it outside of God and above God.

May we untie ourselves day by day, to be free in following Iesus.
