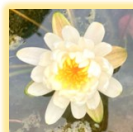

Called to Live as God's Beloved Children

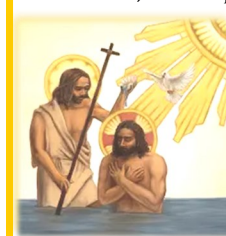
Whenever I celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism, I draw upon one of the Synoptic accounts of Jesus' baptism by John. I remind the parents and all gathered that Jesus had no need of baptism, for John's baptism was a call to repentance from sin. Yet Jesus chose to enter those waters to identify himself fully with humanity, and in that moment the Father revealed his true identity as the beloved Son. In the same way, our own baptism reminds us that we, too, are God's beloved children and that we share in the very life of Jesus.

In one of his sermons, reflecting on the profound connection between the birth and baptism of Jesus, Maximus of Turin observes that at the Nativity, Mary presented the child for the Magi to adore, while at his Baptism, the Father himself revealed that "his Son is to be worshipped by all the nations." In the Gospel of Matthew, this revelation reaches its dramatic climax at the moment of Jesus' death on the cross, when the centurion and those with him, witnessing all that had occurred, proclaim with awe: "Truly this was the Son of God!"

Hence, from the moment of his baptism until his death on the cross, Jesus revealed himself as the beloved Son of the Father and as the Suffering Servant foretold by Isaiah – the one who would bring true justice to the nations and shine as a light for all peoples, especially by freeing those who are burdened.

As we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of Jesus, it is an apt opportunity for us Christians to reflect on and renew our baptismal commitment, recognising it as the foundation of our faith, a call to discipleship, and a moment to reaffirm our promises to live as children of God –rejecting sin and spreading Christ's love and justice. Just as the Baptism of Jesus marked the beginning of his public ministry, this feast invites us to embrace our own mission of service, strengthened and guided by the Holy Spirit.

Finally, and most importantly, the Baptism of Jesus reminds us, as Pope Benedict XVI beautifully



observed, that "God does not hide behind clouds of impenetrable mystery but... has opened the heavens, he has shown himself, he talks to us and is with us; he lives with us and guides us in our lives."

May we continue to live as God's beloved children, ushering in a kingdom of love, peace, and justice!
